#### **Training for Doing Business On and Off-Reserve**

Catalyste+ partnered with First Peoples Economic Growth Fund and the RBC Foundation to deliver a workshop to college and university students in Manitoba on economic development and SMEs. Catalyste+ experts provided Indigenous youth with an overview of what economic development looks like both on and off-reserve, information about taxation for on and off-reserve businesses and the avenues for youth to work in economic development small business, band, and economic development organizations.

#### **Supporting First Nations with Construction Procurement**

Working with the Ministry of Transportation Ontario (MTO) in North Bay, Catalyste+delivered a workshop for First Nation construction entrepreneurs and government officials on best practices for securing work with qualified contractors through MTO's procurement process. The participants learned how to market to qualified contractors, develop a market strategy, position their business to engage with qualified contractors, and obtain relevant and sustainable work through qualified contractors.
