<u>Youth Justice Fund</u>: The Youth Justice Fund provides grants and contributions to support projects that encourage a more effective youth justice system, respond to emerging youth justice issues and enable greater citizen and community participation in the youth justice system. The Youth Justice Fund is currently accepting new proposals for both multi-year and short-term pilot projects starting between April 1, 2026 and March 31, 2027.

- Application Deadline: October 17,2025 at 23:59 PM PST
- Amount: A typical Youth Justice Fund project may cost on average \$600,000 overall and unfold over a four-year period. The funding amount is determined by the project proposal, availability of funds and current priorities.

ARTS, CULTURE, AND LANGUAGE

<u>Building Communities Through Arts and Heritage Program - Legacy Fund Stream:</u> This funding stream provides funding for community – initiative capital projects, intended for community use.

- **Application Deadline:** Projects must be submitted before the anniversary date of the event or personality to be commemorated.
- Amount: Recipients may receive up to 50 per cent of eligible project expenses up to a maximum of \$500,000.
- Region: Across Canada.

<u>Building Communities Through Arts and Heritage Program – Local Festivals:</u> This funding stream provides funding to local groups for recurring festivals that present the work of local artists, artisans, or heritage performers. This includes the celebration of LGBTQ2+ communities and Indigenous cultural celebrations.

- **Application Deadline:** January 31 for festivals starting between September 1 and December 31 of the same calendar year; April 30 for festivals starting between January 1 and June 30 of the next calendar year; and October 15 for festivals starting between July 1 and August 31 of the next calendar year.
- Amount: Applicants may request up to 100 per cent of eligible expenses up to a maximum of \$200,000.

<u>Canada Arts Presentation Fund – Professional Arts Festivals and Performing Arts Series</u>
<u>Presenters:</u> This funding stream supports existing professional arts festivals and performing arts series presenters to offer activities that connect artists with their Canadian communities.

- **Application Deadline:** April 1st and October 15th for projects which will occur after April 1st of the following year (April 1st is the application deadline for projects starting between April 1st and June 30th of the following year.
- Amount: For Professional Arts Festivals, we can fund up to 25% of eligible expenses or a maximum of \$100,000 per fiscal year in the case of grants and 25% of eligible expenses or \$500,000 per year in the case of contributions.

<u>Canada Cultural Spaces Fund:</u> This fund supports the improvement of physical conditions for arts, heritage culture and creative innovation. The fund supports renovation and construction projects, the acquisition of specialized equipment and feasibility studies related to cultural spaces.

<u>Component:</u> This component provides funding to community-based events that promote intercultural or interfaith understanding, promote discussions multiculturalism, diversity, racism and religious discrimination, or celebrate a community's history and culture such as heritage months recognized by Parliament.

Creating, Knowing and Sharing: The Arts and Cultures of First Nations, Inuit and Métis Peoples - Indigenous Organizations: The Indigenous Organizations component of Creating, Knowing and Sharing funds First Nations, Inuit and Métis organizations that engage in contemporary, customary or traditional artistic and cultural activities. These activities can include non-Indigenous artists and collaborations with non-Indigenous organizations. Grants support the exploration of innovative strategies for Indigenous creative and cultural expression, and related administrative activities.

Application Deadline: Fall 2027.
Amount: Grant amount varies.

<u>Sport for Social Development in Indigenous Communities Program – Stream Three</u>: This funding is available annually to provide opportunities for Indigenous women, girls, and 2SLGBTQI+ peoples to participate in meaningful sport, recreational, and physical activities that support one or more of the Stream Three social development goals: physical and mental health; suicide prevention; sexual trafficking awareness and prevention; safe and healthy relationships; and/or sexual positivity (2SLGBTQI+).

• Amount: Maximum funding that can be requested is \$249,999 over two years.

<u>Canada Retraining and Opportunities Initiative - funding program:</u> The Canada Retraining and Opportunities Initiative supports workforce planning and skills training in communities significantly impacted by a mass layoff. <u>Emergency Management Assistance Program:</u> In partnership with First Nations communities, provincial and territorial governments and non-government organizations, this program helps communities on reserve access emergency assistance services. EMAP provides funding to First Nations communities so they can build resiliency, prepare for natural hazards and respond to them using the 4 pillars of emergency management.

<u>Emergency Management FireSmart program:</u> EMAP supports wildland fire non-structural mitigation and preparedness initiatives through the **FireSmart funding stream**. FireSmart builds skills in First Nations communities to prevent and prepare against wildland fires.



Programming involves training First Nations teams in wildfire suppression duties, as well as fuel management and vegetation clearing, which reduces the intensity and spread of wildfires.

Indigenous Innovation and Leadership in Research Network Grants: This funding opportunity's multiple objectives are to: support wholistic Indigenous-led research that addresses community needs and priorities, and include Indigenous methodologies and braided knowledges as an integral part of valid and authoritative research; support Indigenous-led strategies and structures for respectful, mutually beneficial data governance and stewardship in Indigenous research; support innovative training activities within postsecondary institutions, Métis and First Nations communities, and/or Indigenous community-based organizations serving more than one distinction; increase networking and collaboration among Indigenous researchers, communities and postsecondary institutions that transcend disciplinary barriers; support Indigenous students and community members' success through increased capacity and the creation of education and career pathways; support the involvement of Indigenous Elders and Indigenous knowledge-holders in research; and support relationships with the land, the spirits and the ancestors, as well as the more-than-human relatives.

Regional Artificial Intelligence Initiative: The Regional Artificial Intelligence Initiative (RAII) will provide support through two streams: Al productization and commercialization will help Al start-ups and growing firms scale up and address common challenges on their journey from lab prototypes to real-world applications, including securing growth capital, hiring the right people, managing data, and navigating regulatory frameworks; and adoption of Al applications across critical sectors will address the Al adoption lag among Canadian businesses and help enhance productivity, growth and competitiveness. Support will focus on addressing challenges, such as skills gaps, AI integration complexities, and compliance with regulatory and industry standards.

COMMUNITY SAFETY

Aboriginal Community Safety Planning Initiative: This initiative works to prevent incidents of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls, provides to enhance accessibility to Restorative Justice Programming, and responds to the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

<u>Canada Community Security Program (CCSP):</u> Public Safety Canada (PS) is working to build a safe and resilient Canada and has a renewed commitment to this goal through the Canada Community Security Program (CCSP). The CCSP provides time-limited funding and support for communities at risk of <u>hate-motivated incidents and hate-motivated crimes</u> to enhance physical security at their gathering spaces.

<u>Agricultural Clean Technology Program: Research and Innovation Stream:</u> The Research and Innovation Stream will support pre-market innovation, including research, development, demonstration and commercialization activities, to develop transformative clean technologies



and enable the expansion of current technologies, in 3 priority areas green energy and energy efficiency, precision agriculture, and bioeconomy.

- Application Deadline: The application intake period for the program is open. Deadline not specified.
- Amount: The maximum amount payable to a recipient will generally not exceed \$2 million per project. The maximum amount payable to a recipient with multiple projects will generally not exceed \$5 million.

<u>Community Opportunity Readiness Program:</u> This program addresses the financial needs of Indigenous communities when they are in pursuit of, and wish to participate in, an economic opportunity. The program is a consolidation of the former community economic opportunities program, the major projects investment fund, and the community-based components of the Indigenous business development program.

- Amount: Assistance will be commensurate with assessment of the risk involved, the resources of the recipient, and the benefit to the First Nation and Inuit community. Assistance will generally be determined on the basis that the amount and level of funding are the minimum required to ensure that the project can proceed. <u>Contaminated Sites On-Reserve program:</u> This program provides funding to First Nations to identify, assess and remediate contaminated sites on reserve lands and other lands under the department's responsibility. The program's objectives include reducing risks to human health and the environment; ensuring that reserve lands are available for economic and community development or traditional use; and reducing federal liability associated with contaminated sites.

<u>First Nations Adapt Program:</u> This program provides support to First Nation communities and organizations located south of the 60th parallel to assess and respond to the impacts of climate change, and increase climate resilience, in support of self-determined priorities. Northern REACHE Program: The Northern Responsible Energy Approach for Community Heat and Electricity program, also called the Northern REACHE program, funds renewable energy and energy efficiency projects, and related capacity building and planning in: Yukon, Northwest Territories, Nunavut, Nunavik, and Nunatsiavut. The program objective is to reduce Northern communities' reliance on diesel for heating and electricity by increasing the use of local renewable energy sources and energy efficiency.

GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

<u>Canadian Benefit for Parents of Young Victims of Crime:</u> If you are a parent or legal guardian who consider to/or have taken time away from work and suffered a loss of income to cope with the death or disappearance of your child or children, you may be eligible for federal income support. PrairiesCan will invest \$9.6M in projects such as designing and upscaling of modular homes, the use of 3D printing, mass timber construction, panelized construction, as well as implementing net-zero and climate resilient housing practices.
