GOVERNMENT OF CANADA CALLS FOR PROPOSALS AND FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES:

New funding opportunities

Commemorating the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation: The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation component of the Commemorate Canada program provides funding to eligible recipients for initiatives that increase awareness and commemorate the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation (September 30).

• Application Deadline: January 23, 2026, at 4:00 PM (ET)

• Amount: Up to a maximum of \$10,000

• Region: National

<u>Creating, Knowing and Sharing: The Arts and Cultures of First Nations, Inuit and Métis Peoples – Small Scale Activities</u>: Funds activities that will advance your artistic career or practice. This may include acquiring materials for artistic production, engaging in career or artistic development activities or benefitting from specific expertise, advice or training from a professional artist or cultural carrier. First Nations, Inuit and Métis individuals, artistic groups, collectives and organizations working in all disciplines can apply.

• Application Deadline: Any time before the start date of your project or activity

• Amount: Up to 5,000 per year

• Region: National

<u>Education Partnerships Program</u>: This proposal-based program is designed to advance First Nations student achievement in First Nations, independent, provincial and territorial schools.

- Application Deadline: December 19, 2025, at 11:59 p.m. Pacific time
 - The <u>Partnerships</u> and <u>Structural Readiness</u> components is now open.
 The <u>Regional Education Agreement</u> Development component will be launched at a later date.
- Amount: Approved funding amounts will be based on the available regional allocations.

ARTS, CULTURE, AND LANGUAGE

<u>Building Communities Through Arts and Heritage Program - Legacy Fund Stream:</u> This funding stream provides funding for community – initiative capital projects, intended for community use.

- **Application Deadline:** Projects must be submitted before the anniversary date of the event or personality to be commemorated.
- Amount: Recipients may receive up to 50 per cent of eligible project expenses up to a maximum of \$500,000.
- Region: Across Canada.

<u>Building Communities Through Arts and Heritage Program – Local Festivals:</u> This funding stream provides funding to local groups for recurring festivals that present the work of local artists, artisans, or heritage performers. This includes the celebration of LGBTQ2+ communities and Indigenous cultural celebrations.

- **Application Deadline:** January 31 for festivals starting between September 1 and December 31 of the same calendar year; April 30 for festivals starting between January 1 and June 30 of the next calendar year; and October 15 for festivals starting between July 1 and August 31 of the next calendar year.
- Amount: Applicants may request up to 100 per cent of eligible expenses up to a maximum of \$200,000.
- Region: Across Canada.

<u>Canada Arts Presentation Fund – Professional Arts Festivals and Performing Arts Series</u>

<u>Presenters:</u> This funding stream supports existing professional arts festivals and performing arts series presenters to offer activities that connect artists with their Canadian communities.

- **Application Deadline:** April 1st and October 15th for projects which will occur after April 1st of the following year (April 1st is the application deadline for projects starting between April 1st and June 30th of the following year.
- Amount: For Professional Arts Festivals, we can fund up to 25% of eligible expenses or a maximum of \$100,000 per fiscal year in the case of grants and 25% of eligible expenses or \$500,000 per year in the case of contributions.

<u>Canada Cultural Spaces Fund:</u> This fund supports the improvement of physical conditions for arts, heritage culture and creative innovation. The fund supports renovation and construction projects, the acquisition of specialized equipment and feasibility studies related to cultural spaces.

<u>Creating, Knowing and Sharing: The Arts and Cultures of First Nations, Inuit and Métis Peoples - Indigenous Organizations:</u> The Indigenous Organizations component of *Creating, Knowing and Sharing* funds First Nations, Inuit and Métis organizations that engage in contemporary, customary or traditional artistic and cultural activities. These activities can



include non-Indigenous artists and collaborations with non-Indigenous organizations. Grants support the exploration of innovative strategies for Indigenous creative and cultural expression, and related administrative activities.

Application Deadline: Fall 2027
Amount: Grant amount varies
Region: Across Canada

<u>Component (*Note: new deadline):</u> This component provides funding to community-based events that promote intercultural or interfaith understanding, promote discussions multiculturalism, diversity, racism and religious discrimination, or celebrate a community's history and culture such as heritage months recognized by Parliament.

<u>Museum Assistance Program – Exhibition Circulation Fund:</u> This funding opportunity assists museums with the costs related to the hosting of travelling exhibitions originating from another museum or from a federal heritage institution and the borrowing of artefacts from any of the National museums of Canada. Indigenous governing bodies or organizations with a mandate to preserve and support Indigenous heritage are eligible to apply.

• **Application Deadline:** Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis and can be submitted at any time during the year.

CAPACITY

Canada Retraining and Opportunities Initiative - funding program: The Canada Retraining and Opportunities Initiative supports workforce planning and skills training in communities significantly impacted by a mass layoff. It provides funding for community-based projects that help workers develop the skills they need to transition to new jobs. Who can apply: Not-for-profit organizations, for-profit organizations, municipal governments, Indigenous organizations or governments, and educational institutions.

 Closing Date: Applications will be accepted on a continuous basis until funding is fully committed.

<u>Computers for Schools Plus:</u> Computers for Schools plus (CFS+) is not just for schools! We provide digital devices and accessories to schools, low-income Canadians, not-for-profit organizations, and Indigenous communities. To obtain digital devices and accessories, please contact your local <u>CFS+ Affiliate</u>.

<u>Emergency Management Assistance Program:</u> In partnership with First Nations communities, provincial and territorial governments and non-government organizations, this program helps communities on reserve access emergency assistance services. EMAP provides funding to First Nations communities so they can build resiliency, prepare for natural hazards and respond to them using the 4 pillars of emergency management.

Closing Date: OngoingAmount: Not specifiedRegion: Across Canada

<u>Emergency Management FireSmart program:</u> EMAP supports wildland fire non-structural mitigation and preparedness initiatives through the **FireSmart funding stream**. FireSmart builds skills in First Nations communities to prevent and prepare against wildland fires. Programming involves training First Nations teams in wildfire suppression duties, as well as fuel management and vegetation clearing, which reduces the intensity and spread of wildfires.

• **Application Deadline:** Project proposals will be considered on an ongoing basis until the funds are exhausted or until March 31, 2026.

Regional Artificial Intelligence Initiative: The Regional Artificial Intelligence Initiative (RAII) will provide support through two streams: Al productization and commercialization will help Al start-ups and growing firms scale up and address common challenges on their journey from lab prototypes to real-world applications, including securing growth capital, hiring the right people, managing data, and navigating regulatory frameworks; and adoption of Al applications across critical sectors will address the Al adoption lag among Canadian businesses and help enhance productivity, growth and competitiveness. Support will focus on addressing challenges faced by SMEs, such as skills gaps, Al integration complexities, and compliance with regulatory and industry standards.

Regional Artificial Intelligence Initiative (RAII) for Northern Ontario: The Regional Artificial Intelligence Initiative (RAII) will help bridge the gap between cutting-edge AI research and broader marketplace consumption with support spanning two pillars: AI productization and commercialization — Support AI scale-ups address common challenges on their journey from lab prototypes to real-world applications, including securing growth capital, talent acquisition, data management, and navigating regulatory and business conduct frameworks; and adoption of AI applications — Support will address AI adoption lag among small and



medium-sized enterprises. Support will focus on addressing challenges, such as skills gaps, AI integration complexities, and compliance with regulatory and industry standards.

<u>Strategic Partnerships Initiative:</u> This funding initiative provides a way for federal partners to coordinate their efforts, reduce administrative burden and pool resources in support of Indigenous communities. This initiative helps Indigenous communities participate in complex economic opportunities.

COMMUNITY SAFETY

<u>Aboriginal Community Safety Planning Initiative:</u> This initiative works to prevent incidents of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls, provides to enhance accessibility to Restorative Justice Programming, and responds to the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

• Application Deadline: Ongoing

• Amount: Maximum of \$1 million per recipient, per year

<u>Canada Community Security Program (CCSP):</u> Public Safety Canada (PS) is working to build a safe and resilient Canada and has a renewed commitment to this goal through the Canada Community Security Program (CCSP). The CCSP provides time-limited funding and support for communities at risk of hate-motivated incidents and hate-motivated crimes to enhance physical security at their gathering spaces.

- Application Deadline: Ongoing
- Amount: CCSP will fund up to 70% of eligible costs to a maximum contribution of \$1.5 million per project, the remaining 30% of the project's cost are covered by the recipient.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

<u>Agricultural Clean Technology Program: Research and Innovation Stream:</u> The Research and Innovation Stream will support pre-market innovation, including research, development,



demonstration and commercialization activities, to develop transformative clean technologies and enable the expansion of current technologies, in 3 priority areas green energy and energy efficiency, precision agriculture, and bioeconomy.

- Application Deadline: The application intake period for the program is open. Deadline not specified.
- Amount: The maximum amount payable to a recipient will generally not exceed \$2 million per project. The maximum amount payable to a recipient with multiple projects will generally not exceed \$5 million.

<u>Community Opportunity Readiness Program:</u> This program addresses the financial needs of Indigenous communities when they are in pursuit of, and wish to participate in, an economic opportunity. The program is a consolidation of the former community economic opportunities program, the major projects investment fund, and the community-based components of the Indigenous business development program.

- Amount: Assistance will be commensurate with assessment of the risk involved, the
 resources of the recipient, and the benefit to the First Nation and Inuit community.
 Assistance will generally be determined on the basis that the amount and level of
 funding are the minimum required to ensure that the project can proceed. Assistance
 will be provided only to those initiatives that, in the opinion of the minister, would not
 otherwise proceed in the proposed location, proposed scope, or proposed time
 without such assistance.

<u>Indigenous Pathfinder Service:</u> This is a one-stop shop for advice and referral to help navigate the relevant information, tools and support available to start or expand activities in the agriculture and agri-food sector. The service strives to ensure you do not miss out on support and other business opportunities available.

<u>Innovative Communities Fund:</u> This program supports projects that build the economies of communities in Atlantic Canada.

<u>Contaminated Sites On-Reserve program:</u> This program provides funding to First Nations to identify, assess and remediate contaminated sites on reserve lands and other lands under the department's responsibility. The program's objectives include reducing risks to human health and the environment; ensuring that reserve lands are available for economic and community development or traditional use; and reducing federal liability associated with contaminated sites.

<u>Critical Minerals Infrastructure Fund – Indigenous Grants</u>: This fund supports the development and deployment of clean energy and transportation infrastructure that is necessary to enable the development and expansion of critical minerals projects in Canada. The Indigenous Grants stream was established to provide Indigenous groups impacted by these critical minerals infrastructure projects with the resources necessary to actively engage on, participate in, and benefit from critical minerals development.

- Application Deadline: December 17, 2025, 11:59 PM PST
- Amount: The maximum funding available per organization ranges from \$150,000 to \$200,000, depending on the location of the applicant or Indigenous partner organization, as outlined below:

<u>First Nations Adapt Program:</u> This program provides support to First Nation communities and organizations located south of the 60th parallel to assess and respond to the impacts of climate change, and increase climate resilience, in support of self-determined priorities. The program accepts project proposals year-round.

Northern REACHE Program: The Northern Responsible Energy Approach for Community Heat and Electricity program, also called the Northern REACHE program, funds renewable energy and energy efficiency projects, and related capacity building and planning in: Yukon, Northwest Territories, Nunavut, Nunavik, and Nunatsiavut. The program objective is to reduce Northern communities' reliance on diesel for heating and electricity by increasing the use of local renewable energy sources and energy efficiency.

GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

<u>Canadian Benefit for Parents of Young Victims of Crime:</u> If you are a parent or legal guardian who consider to/or have taken time away from work and suffered a loss of income to cope with the death or disappearance of your child or children, you may be eligible for federal income support. The benefit provides eligible parents with payments of \$500 per week, paid every 2 weeks, for a maximum of 35 weeks over a period of 3 years.

PrairiesCan will invest \$9.6M in projects such as designing and upscaling of modular homes, the use of 3D printing, mass timber construction, panelized construction, as well as implementing net-zero and climate resilient housing practices.
