Accelerating Women's Empowerment (AWE) is CESO's flagship program that launched in 2020 in partnership with **Global Affairs Canada (GAC).**

ULTIMATE OUTCOME

Through AWE, CESO aims to achieve improved economic and/or social well-being of the poorest, most marginalized and vulnerable people, particularly women and girls, in developing countries, with a view to contributing to the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

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GENDER EQUALITY & WOMEN'S ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT (GE/WEE) APPROACH

Gender equality (GE) refers to the equal rights, responsibilities, status and opportunities of women and men on political, social, economic and cultural levels.



Our GE/WEE approach is centered on three pillars:



Women's access to resources

When a woman has the capacity to obtain productive resources required to enhance her economic position



Women's agency

When a woman has the capacity to make decisions and act on opportunities that lead to economic advancement and the ability to influence her surroundings



An enabling environment for GE

The underlying context where GE and WEE exist, including the regulatory and legal framework

ASSUMPTIONS
